What to bring for your pets stay!

FOOD

- If your pet is on a special or prescription diet, please bring your own labeled, pre-bagged food. This eliminates chances for under/over feeding, food waste, and expedites the overall feeding process. It's a good rule of thumb to pack an extra couple days of food just in case you unexpectedly extend your pet's stay.
- We also have high quality food on site if you choose to just let us serve your pet! We serve Purina EN (wet and dry available) which is a Gastroenteric formula, that is easy to digest and made with high-quality ingredients. We are happy to serve our food at no additional cost to you.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

- We want your best friend to feel like they're home! However, we do have a few restrictions. Please keep your personal bedding/beds at home! We provide towels, bedding, beds or cots as needed for all pets staying in our care. If your pet is a chewer please let us know so that we can make sure they have chew safe bedding (or no bedding, at your request).
- Please keep toys to a limit of 2 per pet.

MEDICATIONS

All medications should be in their original containers with their label clearly readable. Please bring enough for your pet's stay, plus a few days in case their stay is unexpectedly extended. Medications are administered at no additional cost.

VACCINATIONS

We require the following vaccinations: Rabies, DHLPP, and Bordetella for dogs and FVRCP and Rabies for cats. These vaccinations must be up-to-date for your pet to stay with us. Proof of vaccination is required before check-in. If your pet is due for vaccinations upon drop off, they will be administered by Mercy Veterinary Hospital and billed for you at pick up from Mercy Pet Resort.

Overview of checklist for your pet's stay!

- Pre-bagged, labeled meals
- Medication in original containers w/clear labeled instructions
- Proof of Vaccinations (sent before check-in)
- Toys/Personal Belongings (limit 2 per pet)
